ASSIGNMENTS

CLASS NOTES (10%): during each class meeting, ONE person will take notes on the class discussion and present a brief précis of the discussion at the beginning of the next class. *You cannot miss any of these assignments*. Graded as check, check plus, check minus, or zero.

CLASS PREPARATION (20%): on the day of the next class meeting after discussion of each chapter, EACH person will write a report for each reading assignment and turn it at class. Reports must be a minimum of one double-spaced page in length (@ 250 words) and should accurately and concisely identify the major arguments presented in the reading assignment. There are ten chapters assigned from our three books and *you will be able to miss 3 total of these assignments*. Graded as check, check plus, check minus, or zero.

CLASS PRESENTATION (20%): twice during the semester (weeks 9 and 16), EACH person will make a class presentation. Presentations should accurately and concisely identify the major arguments presented in a particular passage in Bergson AND pose questions grounded in those ideas for class discussion. Presentations will be ten minutes in length. A written version of the presentation must be a minimum of three-double spaced pages in length (@ 750 words) and is due in class on the day of the presentation. Graded as A, B, C, D, F.

TERM PAPER (50%): UNDERGRADUATES: 1 term paper (10 pages: 50%). You must turn in a thesis and outline prior to 26 March and a rough draft prior to 23 April. Graded as A, B, C, D, F.
